AN ORDINANCE REQUIRING REGULATORY COMPLIANCE FOR THE UNLOADING, TRANSFER, STORAGE, SALE, DELIVERY, DISTRIBUTION, OR UTILIZATION WITHIN THE PROVINCE OF ISABELA OF SAND, GRAVEL, AND OTHER QUARRY RESOURCES EXTRACTED OUTSIDE THE PROVINCE, IMPOSING A REGULATORY FEE THEREFOR, AND PRESCRIBING MEASURES FOR COMPLIANCE

EXPLANATORY NOTE

The Provincial Government of Isabela recognizes the need to regulate the unloading, transfer, storage, sale, delivery, distribution, and utilization within the Province of sand, gravel, and other quarry resources extracted outside its territorial jurisdiction. While quarry resources remain indispensable to construction, infrastructure, trade, and development, their movement and local use must be attended by proper monitoring, verification, and documentation in order to protect the environment, preserve public infrastructure, and promote the general welfare.

AN ORDINANCE REQUIRING REGULATORY COMPLIANCE FOR THE UNLOADING, TRANSFER, STORAGE, SALE, DELIVERY, DISTRIBUTION, OR UTILIZATION WITHIN THE PROVINCE OF ISABELA OF SAND, GRAVEL, AND OTHER QUARRY RESOURCES EXTRACTED OUTSIDE THE PROVINCE, IMPOSING A REGULATORY FEE THEREFOR, AND PRESCRIBING MEASURES FOR COMPLIANCE

The Province likewise acknowledges that the effects of quarrying and aggregate movement are not confined to the place of extraction. Heavy-load transport contributes to the deterioration of provincial roads, bridges, and related public works, while undocumented, misdeclared, or irregular shipments undermine transparency, distort fair competition, and weaken the enforcement of environmental and local regulatory requirements. These cross-boundary effects justify the adoption of a local system for the monitoring and compliance administration of quarry resources that are to be made available for use within Isabela.

This Ordinance does not regulate quarry extraction outside the Province of Isabela, nor does it purport to determine the legality of extraction activities in other jurisdictions. Rather, it governs the monitoring, verification, documentation, and compliance administration of quarry resources that are brought into Isabela for local unloading, transfer, storage, sale, delivery, distribution, or utilization. In this manner, the Province exercises its authority to safeguard its environment, infrastructure, and communities in relation to activities occurring within its own territorial jurisdiction.

Consistent with this authority, the Ordinance imposes a Regulatory Fee solely to defray the actual and reasonable costs of monitoring, verification, documentation, checkpoint operations, and compliance administration under the Ordinance. The fee is imposed only in relation to quarry resources intended to be made available for use within the Province, while genuine transit-only shipments remain exempt subject to documentary and monitoring requirements.

Through this measure, the Provincial Government of Isabela reaffirms its commitment to environmental protection, infrastructure preservation, lawful commerce, and responsible resource management by ensuring that quarry resources made available for use within the Province are properly monitored and documented.

In view of the foregoing, the enactment of this Ordinance is earnestly sought.

Section 1. Declaration of Policy. It is hereby declared the policy of the Province of Isabela to protect the environment, preserve public infrastructure, and promote the general welfare by ensuring that sand, gravel, and other quarry resources extracted outside the Province and intended for unloading, transfer, storage, sale, delivery, distribution, or utilization within Isabela are subject to lawful monitoring, verification, and documentation, consistent with applicable laws, rules, and regulations.

The Province recognizes that the environmental and infrastructural effects of quarrying and aggregate movement may transcend jurisdictional boundaries and may adversely affect communities, ecosystems, roads, bridges, and other public works within Isabela.

Accordingly, this Ordinance seeks to ensure transparency, accountability, and compliance in the local availability and use of such quarry resources within the Province.

Section 2. Coverage. This Ordinance shall apply to all individuals, businesses, corporations, cooperatives, associations, or entities engaged in the transport, sale, delivery, transfer, storage, distribution, or utilization of sand, gravel, or other quarry resources:

- a. extracted outside the Province of Isabela and intended to be unloaded, transferred, stored, sold, delivered, distributed, or otherwise made available for use within the Province of Isabela; or
- b. declared, represented, or documented as having been extracted outside the Province of Isabela for the same purposes.

Section 2.1. This Ordinance shall cover, among others:

- a. All transporters carrying quarry resources destined for unloading, transfer, storage, sale, delivery, distribution, or utilization within the Province of Isabela;
- b. All consignees, contractors, suppliers, project owners, end-users, and other persons or entities that cause or benefit from the unloading, transfer, storage, sale, delivery, distribution, or utilization of such quarry resources within the Province; and
- c. All designated checkpoints, monitoring stations, and provincial offices tasked with the administration and enforcement of this Ordinance.

Section 2.2. This Ordinance shall not apply to:

- a. Quarry resources extracted, sourced, and utilized exclusively within the Province of Isabela, which shall remain governed by existing provincial and municipal laws, ordinances, rules, and regulations; and
- b. Quarry resources merely passing through the Province of Isabela without unloading, transfer, storage, sale, delivery, distribution, or utilization therein, which shall be governed by the Transit-Only Exemption under Section 5 of this Ordinance.

Nothing in this Ordinance shall be construed to regulate quarry extraction outside the Province of Isabela. Any deliberate misdeclaration of source shall be dealt with under the applicable penal and enforcement provisions hereof, without prejudice to the enforcement of applicable provincial and municipal fees, taxes, and regulatory requirements within Isabela.

Section 3. Definition of Terms. For purposes of this Ordinance, the following terms shall mean:

- a. Quarry Resources – Sand, gravel, and other naturally occurring minerals and aggregates extracted from riverbeds, mountains, land areas, or other lawful extraction sites for construction, commercial, industrial, or infrastructure use.

- b. Transporter – Any natural or juridical person engaged in the hauling, delivery, transfer, or transport of quarry resources, whether for commercial sale, government projects, or private use.
- c. Consignee / End-User – The contractor, supplier, project owner, buyer, recipient, or any other person or entity for whose benefit quarry resources are unloaded, transferred, stored, sold, delivered, distributed, or utilized within the Province of Isabela.
- d. Regulatory Fee – The amount imposed under this Ordinance to defray the actual and reasonable costs of monitoring, verification, documentation, checkpoint operations, and compliance administration in relation to sand, gravel, and other quarry resources extracted outside the Province of Isabela and intended for unloading, transfer, storage, sale, delivery, distribution, or utilization within the Province.
- e. Fraudulent or Falsified Documents – Forged, altered, falsified, tampered with, materially misleading, or otherwise spurious permits, clearances, receipts, manifests, waybills, transit permits, transport documents, or other related records used or presented in relation to quarry resources covered by this Ordinance.
- f. Verification and Monitoring System – The system established by the Provincial Government to inspect, record, monitor, verify the presence and sufficiency of required documents, and administer compliance under this Ordinance.
- g. Point of Entry – Any designated checkpoint, inspection site, or border area where quarry resources covered by this Ordinance are subject to inspection, recording, and monitoring upon entry into the Province of Isabela.
- h. Transit Permit – The official transit authorization issued without charge by the Provincial Government of Isabela to a transporter of sand, gravel, or other quarry resources whose declared destination and intended utilization are outside the Province of Isabela, allowing the vehicle to traverse the Province solely in transit and without unloading, transfer, storage, sale, delivery, distribution, or utilization therein. The Transit Permit shall indicate the vehicle details, declared destination, intended route, designated exit point, and validity period, and shall be valid for one (1) trip only and non-transferable.
- i. Checkpoints and Monitoring Stations – Authorized locations established by the Provincial Government for purposes of inspection, recording, verification, and monitoring under this Ordinance.
- j. Proof of Source – The permits, clearances, waybills, manifests, delivery receipts, transport documents, or other records showing the declared point of extraction, permit number, point of origin, and destination of quarry resources.

Section 4. Imposition of Regulatory Fee. A Regulatory Fee in the amount of One Thousand Five Hundred Pesos (₱1,500.00) is hereby imposed for regulatory services rendered under this Ordinance in connection with the monitoring, verification, documentation, and

compliance administration of sand, gravel, or other quarry resources extracted outside the Province of Isabela and intended for unloading, transfer, storage, sale, delivery, distribution, or utilization within the Province.

The Regulatory Fee shall be due primarily from the consignee, contractor, supplier, project owner, end-user, or any other person or entity responsible for, or benefiting from, the unloading, transfer, storage, sale, delivery, distribution, or utilization of such quarry resources within the Province of Isabela.

The transporter shall be liable only where the shipment is unloaded, transferred, stored, sold, delivered, distributed, or otherwise made available for use within the Province without proof of payment of the Regulatory Fee or without the required regulatory compliance under this Ordinance.

The Regulatory Fee shall be paid prior to unloading, transfer, storage, sale, delivery, distribution, or utilization within the Province of Isabela, and proof of payment shall be presented upon inspection at the designated monitoring station and upon demand of duly authorized personnel.

The proceeds collected under this Section shall be applied exclusively to the actual and reasonable expenses necessary for the implementation and enforcement of this Ordinance.

Section 5. Transit-Only Exemption. Transportation vehicles or equipment carrying sand, gravel, or other quarry resources extracted outside the Province of Isabela that enter the Province solely for transit and are intended for delivery and utilization outside the Province of Isabela, and without unloading, transfer, storage, sale, delivery, distribution, or utilization within the Province, shall be exempt from the Regulatory Fee imposed under the immediately preceding section, provided that:

- a. Upon arrival at the designated checkpoint, the transporter presents complete and sufficient transport and source documents showing an out-of-province destination, including the consignee or project site address outside Isabela, such as delivery receipt, waybill, manifest, and related transport permits and clearances required under applicable laws, rules, or regulations; and
- b. The transporter secures a Transit Permit which shall indicate the vehicle details, declared destination, intended route, designated exit point, and allowed transit period, the validity of which shall not exceed one (1) day from its issuance; no fee shall be collected for the issuance of the Transit Permit.

The Transit Permit shall be presented and surrendered for exit confirmation at the designated exit point within its validity period.

Nothing in this Section shall be construed to exempt any person, transporter, or entity from submitting the required documents for recording and monitoring purposes while passing through the Province. Any deliberate and material false, fraudulent, or misleading invocation of the transit-only exemption through falsified or materially misleading documentation shall constitute misrepresentation and may give rise to liability under Section 7 of this Ordinance.

Section 6. Voidance of Exemption. The transit-only exemption under Section 5 shall be deemed void, and the shipment shall be treated as subject to the Regulatory Fee, if any of the following occurs:

- a. The transporter fails to secure a Transit Permit as required under Section 5(b);
- b. The transporter fails to present complete and sufficient documents indicating an out-of-province destination, as required under Section 5(a);
- c. The transporter fails to present the vehicle for exit confirmation at the designated exit point within the prescribed period appearing in the Transit Permit, without justifiable cause, as determined by the designated monitoring station based on recorded circumstances; or
- d. The transporter unloads, transfers, stores, sells, delivers, distributes, or otherwise makes the quarry resources available within the Province of Isabela.

In case of voidance, the transporter and the person or entity primarily liable under Section 4 shall be processed under the applicable provisions of this Ordinance, without prejudice to referral to the appropriate national authorities when warranted.

Section 7. Prohibited Acts and Penalties. The following acts are hereby declared prohibited under this Ordinance, and the corresponding penalties shall apply:

- a. **Failure to Pay the Prescribed Regulatory Fee.** Any person or entity who fails or refuses to pay the Regulatory Fee imposed under this Ordinance when the shipment is subject thereto shall be issued a formal assessment and notice of non-payment by the Provincial Treasurer's Office or its duly authorized representative.

No shipment covered by this Ordinance shall be unloaded, transferred, stored, sold, delivered, distributed, or utilized within the Province without proof of payment of the Regulatory Fee.

The unpaid Regulatory Fee shall be subject to the civil remedies for collection provided under the Local Government Code and other applicable laws, including surcharge, interest, administrative action, and judicial action, as may be proper.

- b. **Possession, Use, or Presentation of Fraudulent or Falsified Documents; Misrepresentation.** Any person, transporter, or entity who, after due verification by authorized monitoring personnel, is found to have possessed, used, submitted, or presented fraudulent or falsified documents in relation to quarry resources covered by this Ordinance, or who deliberately misrepresents any material particular in relation thereto, including the declared origin, destination, consignee, route, exit point, or intended purpose, shall be subject to the following:
 - i. Preparation of a formal report and issuance of a notice of violation by the designated monitoring personnel;

- ii. Immediate referral of the matter to the Philippine National Police (PNP), the Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR), and/or other competent national authorities for investigation and proper handling of suspected fraudulent documents;
 - iii. Recommendation for lawful impoundment or seizure to duly authorized enforcement agencies, in accordance with applicable laws and regulations; and
 - iv. Institution of appropriate civil, administrative, or criminal actions, as may be warranted under applicable laws.
- c. **Deliberate Misdeclaration of Source.** Deliberate misdeclaration of the point of extraction or source of quarry resources, including declaring an out-of-province source to evade applicable provincial or municipal fees, taxes, or regulatory requirements within Isabela, shall constitute misrepresentation and a violation of this Ordinance.

In addition to liability under the applicable provisions of this Ordinance, including Section 7(a) where non-payment is involved, the incident shall be referred to the concerned provincial and/or municipal offices within Isabela for the proper assessment, collection, and enforcement of applicable local revenue and regulatory measures, without prejudice to referral to the DENR, PNP, and other competent authorities.

- d. **Participation in the Use or Facilitation of Quarry Resources in Violation of this Ordinance.** Any individual, business, institution, or entity who knowingly purchases, facilitates the acquisition, delivery, or use of quarry resources that are:
- i. unlawfully unloaded, transferred, stored, sold, delivered, distributed, or utilized within the Province in violation of this Ordinance;
 - ii. covered by a voided transit-only exemption under Section 6;
 - iii. supported by fraudulent or falsified documents; or
 - iv. sourced from any person, transporter, or entity who fails or refuses to comply with the Regulatory Fee and documentary requirements under this Ordinance,

shall, upon proper judicial determination, be liable for a fine of **Five Thousand Pesos (₱5,000.00)** without prejudice to endorsement to appropriate national licensing and regulatory agencies for possible administrative sanctions.

Section 8. Grievance and Appeals Mechanism. Any individual, transporter, contractor, consignee, or entity aggrieved by any enforcement action, finding, notice, assessment, or administrative determination made under this Ordinance may file a written grievance or appeal before the Task Force within ten (10) working days from receipt thereof.

The appeal shall be under oath, stating the specific grounds, relevant facts, and supporting evidence. The Task Force shall act on the appeal within fifteen (15) working days from

receipt of the same and may affirm, modify, or reverse the contested administrative action for purposes of implementation and coordination under this Ordinance.

A party adversely affected by the resolution of the Task Force may elevate the matter to the Office of the Governor within five (5) working days from receipt of the Task Force's resolution. The decision of the Governor shall be without prejudice to the pursuit of appropriate judicial or administrative remedies before competent authorities.

Section 9. Creation of a Task Force. To ensure the effective enforcement and administration of this Ordinance, the Provincial Government shall convene a Task Force on the Monitoring and Verification of Quarry Resources, hereinafter referred to as the "Task Force."

Section 10. Task Force Composition. The Task Force shall be composed of the following:

Chairperson: The Governor

Vice Chairperson: The Vice Governor

Members:

1. The Chairperson of the Sangguniang Panlalawigan Committee on Environment and Natural Resources;
2. The Provincial Environment and Natural Resources Officer (PENRO);
3. The Provincial Treasurer;
4. The Provincial Engineer;
5. The Provincial Legal Officer;
6. The Provincial Director of the DENR-MGB, if available;
7. The Provincial Director of the DPWH, if applicable;
8. The Head of the Provincial Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Office (PDRRMO);
9. The Provincial Public Safety Officer (PPSO);
10. The Provincial Police Director, Philippine National Police (PNP) – Isabela;
11. One (1) representative from a recognized local environmental or quarry regulatory advocacy group; and
12. One (1) representative from a quarry operators' association in Isabela.

Any other government officer, agency representative, or resource person may be invited by the Task Force in an advisory or technical capacity, as may be necessary for the effective implementation of this Ordinance.

The Provincial Environment and Natural Resources Office (PENRO) shall serve as the Secretariat of the Task Force and shall be responsible for record-keeping, coordination, and implementation support.

Section 11. Functions and Responsibilities of the Task Force. The Task Force shall have the following support and coordination functions:

A. Monitoring and Verification

- i. Coordinate the implementation of the verification and monitoring system for all quarry resources covered by this Ordinance and intended for unloading, transfer, storage, sale, delivery, distribution, or utilization within the Province;
- ii. Assist in the establishment and operation of checkpoints and monitoring stations to conduct inspection, documentation, and verification of compliance with this Ordinance;
- iii. Verify the presence, completeness, and consistency of permits and other documentary requirements required under applicable national and local laws, rules, and regulations, and refer any apparent falsity, irregularity, or insufficiency to the proper authorities;
- iv. Ensure the proper assessment, collection, and remittance of the Regulatory Fee from persons liable under Section 4, in coordination with the Provincial Treasurer's Office, and ensure the issuance of corresponding official receipts.

B. Environmental Coordination

- i. Coordinate with DENR and other environmental agencies to monitor possible ecological and infrastructural impacts associated with quarry resource movements and local use;
- ii. Support initiatives to discourage illegal quarrying and promote lawful compliance with environmental and resource management standards.

C. Legal and Enforcement Support

- i. Refer and document violations, but shall not exercise quasi-judicial powers;
- ii. Provide evidence, reports, and logistical support to law enforcement, regulatory, and prosecution agencies;
- iii. Coordinate with the PNP, DENR, and other competent authorities in the lawful handling of suspected violations.

D. Information and Reporting

- i. Conduct public information campaigns on the requirements and obligations under this Ordinance;
- ii. Submit quarterly reports to the Sangguniang Panlalawigan and the Office of the Governor regarding implementation, enforcement, assessed fees, collected fees, and reported violations.

Section 12. Periodic Review and Amendment. This Ordinance shall be reviewed every two (2) years from its effectivity to assess its impact, reasonableness, cost-recovery basis, and continued relevance.

Any amendment to the amount of the Regulatory Fee or to the substantive monitoring procedures under this Ordinance shall be made only through a separate ordinance, following appropriate consultation and evaluation.

Section 13. Repealing Clause. All ordinances, resolutions, executive orders, rules, regulations, and other provincial issuances inconsistent with this Ordinance are hereby repealed, amended, or modified accordingly.

Section 14. Effectivity. This Ordinance shall take effect after approval and compliance with the posting and publication requirements under the Local Government Code of 1991.




