# ISABELA IS MOST AWARDED

## Dominates 2017 awards season

Isabela cemented its status as the most awarded province in the Philippines, yielding seven national and six regional trophies in the 2017 awards season, further beefing-up its treasure trove of over sixty awards from the most prestigious national and regional competitions, given by the most credible award giving institutions from both the government and private sectors.

True to form, the province obtained a perfect score in the latest evaluation for the Seal of Good Local Governance of the Department of the Interior and Local Government, shone the brightest at the *Gawad Parangal* of the Cooperative Development Authority via a rare back-to-back victory, made waves at the Department of Agriculture's *Gawad Saka*, and achieved a stunning grand slam in all five major categories of the NDRRMC's *Gawad Kalasag*, the country's DRRM Olympics.

The province aced the most dreaded but highly coveted SGLG, the ultimate test of excellence for any LGU and made a clean sweep of all three *Gawads*, unprecedented in the history of any province and a clear testament to Isabela's versatility and relentless pursuit of excellence in diverse fields of governance ranging from agriculture, to cooperative development and disaster preparedness.

### SGLG

For the third straight year, Isabela copped the Seal of Good Local Governance, the highest and most prestigious award given by the DILG. The province obtained a perfect score in all seven core and essential areas to include *Good Financial Administration, Disaster Preparedness, Social Protection, Peace and Order, Business Friendliness and Competitiveness, Environmental Protection and Tourism, Culture and the Arts.*

SGLG symbolizes integrity and good performance through continuing governance reform and sustained local development. It is a progressive assessment system adopted by the DILG to give recognition to remarkable local government performance across several areas.

Of the country's eighty one provinces, Isabela is among the only twenty eight that made it to the elite winning circle. Twelve municipalities and all three cities of the province also made the cut. Their combined strength accounts for more than 50% of LGU passers in Region II.

Governor Faustino Dy III joined other Local Chief Executives from across the country in receiving the Seal from top DILG official led by then Acting Secretary Catalino Cuy and Presidential Adviser for Political Affairs Francis Tolentino who was guest of honor. The ceremony was held at the Manila Hotel.

### GAWAD PARANGAL

At the Cooperative Development Authority's *Gawad Parangal* held in December last year at Shangri-La Manila, the Isabela Provincial Cooperative Development Office was adjudged Best Performing PCDO in the Philippines, besting Bulacan and Dinagat Islands. The province scored another back-to-back victory after Cauayan City clinched the same honors in the city category.

Governor Dy and Cauayan City Mayor Bernard Dy were joined by local officials and LGU employees in receiving their respective awards from Senator Miguel Zubiri, Chairman of the Senate Committee on Cooperatives.

*Gawad Parangal* is a recognition program for

cooperatives, local government units, partner organizations and cooperative leaders in recognition of exemplary performance, best practices and good governance. It is aimed at motivating and inspiring cooperatives to take on a more active role in government's development programs.

The PCDO is mandated to oversee the provincial government's cooperative program with emphasis on the promotion, organization, education and development of cooperatives in the province. PCDO Isabela first won as Most Outstanding LGU Cooperative Development Office in the Philippines in 2012, and the rest, as they say, is history.

### GAWAD SAKA

Isabela, the center of AGRiculture, also made waves at the *Gawad Saka* of the Department of Agriculture. It was hailed as the region's champion province while eight of its farmer individuals and organizations went on to win at the *Gawad Saka* National Finals held in Malacañang and graced by the president.

The province's excellent performance in the competition is an affirmation of Isabela's agricultural prowess, the diligence of her farmers and fisherfolks and the provincial government's immense support to the agriculture sector through the BRO Program for Marginalized Farmers. Dy noted the quest for excellence even among farmers. "*The quest for excellence has become a culture among Isabeleños. It has become a way of life for the people,*" he said.

*Gawad Saka* is an annual contest to recognize farmers, fisherfolks, and livestock raisers as well as groups who have excelled and made significant contributions in enhancing the development of the agriculture and fishery sector in their respective communities.

Isabela also earned a berth among the finalists in the Philippine Chamber of Commerce and Industry's Search for Most Business Friendly Provinces in the Philippines, and clinched a *Kapit Bisig Award* courtesy of the Bangko Sentral ng Pilipinas during the 14<sup>th</sup> Awards Ceremony for BSP Stakeholders held in Manila last year.

However, it was in Disaster Risk Reduction and Management that Isabela made the most impact, amassing a record eighteen *Gawad Kalasag* championship trophies in the last three editions of the competition. The province's grand slam victory was capped by two *Hall of Fame* honors for PDRRMC Isabela and the PGI's Early Learning Center.

The *Kalasag* symbolizes the Isabeleño's narrative of courage and vigilance, and serves as an inner compass as he navigates the perilous road to resilience. It also stands proud as a testament to his indomitable spirit, a spirit that never wavers even in the face of the fiercest storm lurking in the horizon. From the devastation wrought by supertyphoon Juan in 2010, PDRRMC Isabela has evolved into what it is today – the undisputed Best PDRRMC in the Philippines.

According to the governor, the Council continues to build on its strengths, as it intensifies the training of personnel and invests heavily in top-of-the-line facilities, vehicles and equipment essential to disaster preparedness. *“Two evacuation centers have been built, while three others are in various stages of completion. All these edifices and structures are concrete proof of the provincial government's firm resolve to build safer and disaster resilient communities worthy of all the Gawad Kalasag trophies we have received so far,”* he said.

*Gawad Kalasag* is the country's premier annual awards for outstanding contribution in the fields of disaster risk reduction and management and humanitarian assistance. It is the principal mechanism by which the NDRRMC advances awareness of the best practices of DRRM and humanitarian response and action. Moreover, it aims to appreciate individuals, groups or institutions which have shown extraordinary courage, heroism and sacrifice in times of emergencies, be it natural or human-induced.

## ALL BASES COVERED

The awards reaped by the provincial government covers a broad range yet diverse aspects of governance – good financial administration, disaster preparedness, social protection, peace and order, environmental management, business competitiveness, tourism, culture and the arts, cooperative development, child rights and agriculture, among others.

It brings to the fore a government that values every sector of society, from the largest segment of the populace to the most obscure, optimizing the utilization of its finite resources to address the needs of every individual, regardless of rank or circumstance.

It's all bases covered for Isabela. The winningest province in the Philippines is, yet again, on her way to one dazzling home run!

## Reaps six Hall of Fame trophies

**Any LGU will move mountains to clinch a *Hall of Fame* award. The province of Isabela has six. So far.**

**Two from the Department of Agriculture, two given by the Department of the Interior and Local Government, and another two courtesy of the NDRRMC. The gallery of six *Hall of Fame* honors affirm in no uncertain terms Isabela's unwavering commitment to excellence, the bedrock on which our institutions firmly stand.**

The grains capital of the Philippines is the only province in the country honored with *Hall of Fame* trophies in both the National Rice Achievers Award and the Quality Corn Achievers Award. As the country's top corn producing province, it contributes 21% of the annual national yellow corn production. As the second highest rice growing province nationwide, it produces 15% of the aggregate national rice production on an annual basis.

In 2015, Isabela took center stage at the DILG's Regional LGU Incentives and Awards Program. After winning the Most Outstanding Anti-Red Tape Implementer in Region II for three consecutive years, it was finally inducted into the *Hall of Fame*. The Anti-Red Tape Act of 2007 aims to promote transparency in government through

simplified frontline service providers and formulation of service standards collectively called the Citizen's Charter.

In 2017, Isabela collected two more *Hall of Fame* trophies courtesy of the NDRRMC's *Gawad Kalasag*. The first, for Best Early Learning Center, and the second, for Best PDRRMC in the Philippines. Finally, in the same year, PDRRMC Isabela was elevated to the *Hall of Fame* at the DILG's LGU Incentives and Awards for winning Most Outstanding Project PREPARE-READY 24/7 for three consecutive years.

The province has also won the Seal of Good Local Governance and the *Aliw Awards* for Best Festival Performance and Practices for three consecutive years now.

The *Hall of Fame* is a mechanism aimed at elevating an individual or institution to a league of its own after showing consistency and diligence in demonstrating excellence in a competition. It may be aimed at stopping or breaking a winning streak if only to afford other contenders better chances of winning.

One thing is certain. There's no stopping Isabela from proving beyond a doubt that it is indeed the most awarded province in the Philippines, bar none.

# P E R F E C T

**The Provincial Government of Isabela obtained a perfect score in the evaluation conducted by the Department of the Interior and Local Government for the 2017 Seal of Good Local Governance. This was disclosed by then DILG Acting Secretary Catalino Cuy in a congratulatory letter addressed to Governor Faustino Dy III. Only twenty-eight of the country’s eighty-one provinces passed what is widely regarded as the mother of all awards.**

Isabela passed all four core areas, to include *Good Financial Administration, Disaster Preparedness, Social Protection, Peace and Order*, and all three essential areas to include *Business-Friendliness and Competitiveness, Environmental Protection and Tourism, and Culture and the Arts*. In the SGLG 2017’s 4+1 assessment criteria, an LGU must pass the four core areas and at least one essential area to muster the Seal.

SGLG symbolizes integrity and good performance through continuing governance reform and sustained local government. It is a progressive assessment system adopted by the Department to give distinction to remarkable local government performance across several areas.

The Seal enjoins LGUs to foster transparency and accountability, prepare for challenges posed by disasters, broaden access to social services especially the marginalized

and most vulnerable in the community, protect the community from threats to life and security, attract more businesses for investments and employment, uphold the integrity of the environment and optimize tourism potential and enrich cultural heritage.

*“To pass the SGLG is a feat in itself. To obtain a perfect score in all seven core and essential areas is absolutely exhilarating,”* said Dy. *“This is a clear validation of our unwavering commitment to excellence in governance.”*

Dy personally received the Seal in ceremonies held at the Tent City, Manila Hotel along with local chief executives of the three cities and twelve municipalities of Isabela. The event, dubbed by organizers as a gathering of exemplars, was graced by top DILG officials led by Cuy and Presidential Adviser on Political Affairs Secretary Francis Tolentino.

One of the incentives for SGLG passers is access to the *Performance Challenge Fund*, a facility envisioned to help stimulate local governments to mainstream transparency and accountability and to enable them to finance identified projects supportive of national government goals and priorities.

Local chief executives are now bracing themselves for the far more difficult and stringent measures of the 2018 SGLG evaluation.

# Isabela rocks 19th Gawad Kalasag PDRRMC elevated to Hall of Fame



**P**DRRMC Isabela solidified its status as the country's DRRM champion after winning Best PDRRMC in the Philippines at the 19th Annual Gawad Kalasag Search for Excellence in Disaster Risk Reduction and Management and Humanitarian Assistance held recently at the Crowne Plaza Manila Galleria. This is the Council's third consecutive win, thus, paving the way for its induction into the elite Hall of Fame.

Governor Faustino Dy III and key members of the Council led by PDRRMO Edmond Guzman received the award from NDRRMC Chair and Defense Secretary Delfin Lorenzana, NDRRMC Executive Director and Civil Defense Administrator Undersecretary Ricardo Jalad and DILG Undersecretary Austere Panadero.

PDRRMC Isabela bested PDRRMC Dinagat Islands and PDRRMC Mountain Province. CDRRMC Santiago was also adjudged Best City Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council in the Philippines while the BDRRM Committee of Brgy. Alinguigan 2nd in Ilagan City was hailed as the best in its category. Cauayan City's Rescue 922 won in the Best Government Emergency Management Service category while Raniag National High School of Ramon, Isabela won as Best Public School.

Dy ascended the Gawad Kalasag stage a record seven times, making him the most popular local chief executive in a gathering of the country's heroes and heroines.

*"From the depths of destruction and devastation wrought by super typhoon Juan, to our elevation to the Gawad Kalasag Hall of Fame . . . it was a long and perilous "journey of faith" for the people of Isabela,"* a beaming Dy proudly declared. *"Nawa'y magsisilbi po itong inspirasyon sa ating lahat na lalo pang palawigin at paiging ang kahandaan*

*sa ating lalawigan sa lahat ng pagkakataon. The Hall of Fame trophy should not lull us into complacency. It should instead inspire us to continue to raise the bar in disaster preparedness,"* he stressed.

**T**he general was very pleased.

Isabela won five championship trophies in the competition's major categories capped by Hall of Fame honors for Best PDRRMC in the Philippines.

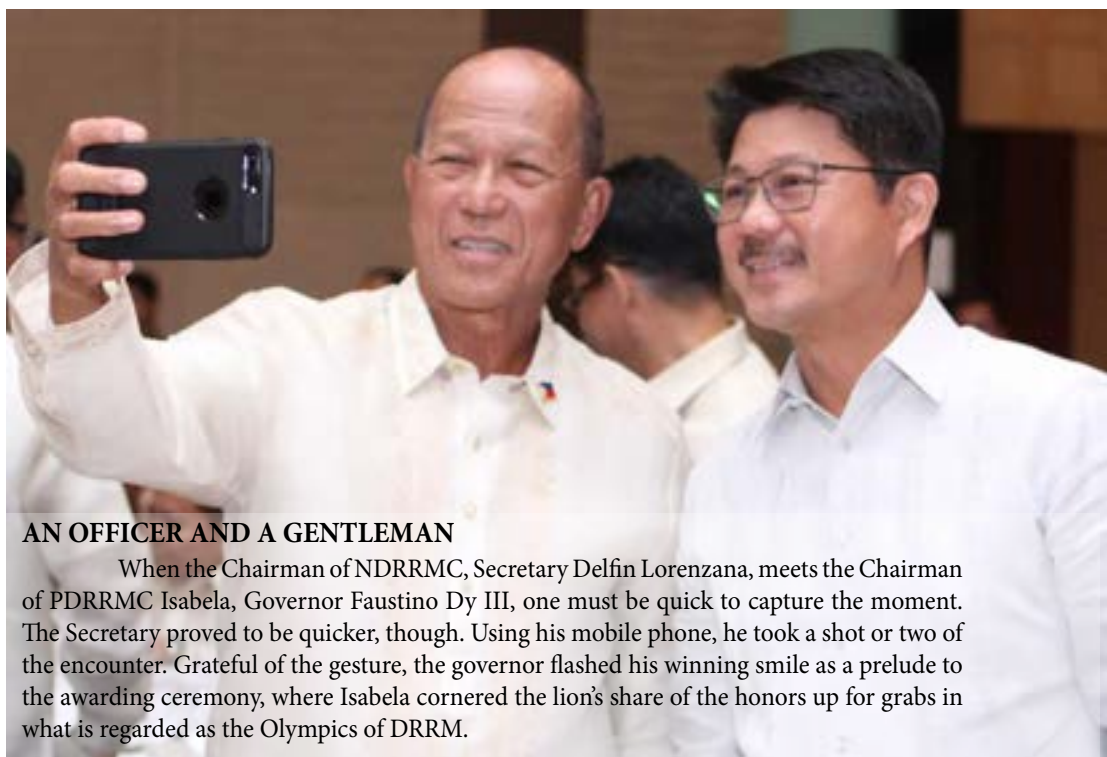

Chamber of Commerce and Industry.

Espenilla thanked the dignitaries from government and the private sector for joining the award rites. *“This event is expected to further improve and strengthen the partnerships between the BSP and its stakeholders, resulting in a more successful information gathering and conduct of advocacy campaigns to accomplish the BSP’s objectives of safeguarding price stability and promoting*

The BSP is the country’s central monetary authority. It was established on July 3, 1993 pursuant to the provisions of the 1987 Constitution and the Central Bank Act of 1993. As such, it enjoys fiscal and administrative autonomy from the national government in the pursuit of its mandate.

# COMPETITIONS MARKED BY BACK-TO-BACK VICTORIES

## Isabela PCDO, Cauayan CCDO adjudged Best in the Philippines



Isabela and Cauayan City made history after scoring a rare back-to-back victory at the Cooperative Development Authority Gawad Parangal held recently at the Edsa Shangri-La in Mandaluyong City.

The Isabela Provincial Cooperative Development Office was adjudged Best PCDO in the Philippines while Cauayan City romped away with the best CCDO in the Philippines trophy as well. Governor Faustino G. Dy III and Mayor Bernard Faustino Dy personally received their respective awards from Guest of Honor Senator Miguel Zubiri and CDA Administrator Orlando Ravanera. The governor was accompanied by SP Member Faustino Dy IV, SP Member Napoleon Hernandez and employees of the Provincial Cooperative Development Office led by PCDO Lilia Castillo.

Even before Dy could reach the stage

to receive his trophy, Zubiri accorded him a snappy salute, a kind and genuine gesture expressing his admiration and respect for one of the country's most outstanding governors who has emerged as a champion of the cooperative movement.

In his message, Zubiri underscored the crucial role of the LGUs in strengthening cooperatives as a means to eradicate poverty in the countryside. The young senator also lauded the efforts of local officials in strengthening cooperatives in their respective areas of responsibility and cited Isabela and Cauayan City as classic examples. "The victory of Isabela in the competition is a clear proof that they are doing it right in that province," he stressed. Zubiri is the principal sponsor and author of RA 9520 or the Philippine Cooperative Code of 2008. He chairs the Senate Committee on Cooperatives.

CDA Administrator Orlando Ravanera also praised Dy for his support to the CDA and the community of cooperatives at large. Addressing the Isabela governor, "You are an excellent local chief executive, there ought to be a book written about you," he declared in his message before a gathering of government dignitaries led by Zubiri and Secretary to the Cabinet Leoncio Evasco, local officials and leaders of cooperatives.

In 2012, Dy and then Vice Governor Rodito Albano, launched the BRO Livelihood Assistance for Marginalized Farmers Program to the tune of two hundred million pesos, surpassing previous allotments intended for the purpose. The funds were released to individual borrowers, cooperatives and associations in the form of livelihood loan assistance. Castillo took pride in heralding the emergence of Isabela's new breed of borrowers. "They voluntarily pay their dues, fully aware of their responsibilities as borrowers," she said.

The Isabela PCDO is mandated to oversee the provincial government's cooperative program with emphasis on the promotion, organization, education and development of cooperatives in the province.

BRO Farmers Assistance Program is an all encompassing, comprehensive and revolutionary program which boasts of thirteen components ranging from loan assistance (BRO-LAMFP), livelihood assistance (BRO-Livelihood), crop insurance (BRO-PSP), price subsidy (BRO-ASAP), transport subsidy (BROPPP), animal dispersal (Paiwi ni BRO), accident insurance (BRO-PNB Gen), SSS coverage (BROSSSM), health insurance (BRO-Healthcare), health coverage (BRO-PHM), college scholarship program for sons and daughters of small farmers (BRO-Ed), nutrition (BRO LUSOG or Laban sa Undernutrition, sa Sakit, Obesity at Gutom sa Barangay), and access to housing assistance (BRO-PAGIBIG).

# PGI is ISO

**CERTIFIED**

**T**he Provincial Government of Isabela, a three-time SGLG laureate, merited another seal of approval – an ISO 9001:2008 certification, proof positive of the excellence and efficiency in the management systems, processes and procedures governing the operations of the LGU.

ISO 9001:2008 enables an organization to align or integrate its own Quality Management System (QMS) with the management system requirements of the provincial government. It encourages and promotes improved public sector performance and ensures that the province's frontline services or core processes meet global standards. It is therefore a clear validation of the superiority of the administration and support services of the province.

Independent assessment of the PGI was conducted by KMAR Philippines, an internationally accredited certification body. All department heads and their designated documenters and internal auditors underwent a series of trainings to enable them to understand the intricacies of the processes and procedures involved.

An Internal Quality Audit Training was also conducted to train the candidates for Internal Quality Auditor in the planning and actual evaluation of the

Internal Quality Audit and in the demonstration of the audit report.

Governor Faustino Dy III expressed elation over this recent development. *“Every time we win an award, I always attribute our triumph not only to the officials of the province, but to its workforce as well. The ISO is a validation of the diligence and commitment to excellence of every employee of the PGI,”* he said. *“Our employees once again rose to the occasion. They embraced the culture of excellence in the workplace, and they have become better public servants. The people are the ultimate beneficiaries,”* he added.

In a related development, select PGI employees attended a two-day Macro Vision Consultancy Awareness and Risk Management Training held April 24 – 25, 2018 at the Balay. Mr. Michael Manaloto of KMAR was resource speaker. The training was designed to further enumerate and expand the detailed requirements of ISO 9001:2015 including the process of revising the existing system and practices to comply with ISO's new set of standards.

Manaloto emphasized that all organizations using ISO 9001 are encouraged to transition to ISO 9001:2005 within a span of three years. *“When the transition stage ends in September 2018, all ISO 9001:2008 certificates will no longer be valid,”* he said.

In a political arena fraught with adversity,  
leaders rise,  
In the crucible of competitions,  
champions emerge.



*Hail to* **The CHAMP**

We are all pilgrims here on earth. Every person is on a journey through life, a leader to others. Some lead with notoriety, others with ignominy. But there are those who aspire for positions of leadership to better serve the people, who desire nothing less than to leave an indelible imprint of excellence.

There are three crucial tests of excellence in leadership and governance for the country's eighty-one governors. First, the Search for the TEN MOST OUTSTANDING GOVERNORS IN THE PHILIPPINES of the Office of the President, second, Superbrand's OUTSTANDING GOVERNORSHIP AWARD, a purely private initiative, and third, the SEAL OF GOOD LOCAL GOVERNANCE of the Department of the Interior and Local Government, the ultimate test for any local chief executive.

Only one governor made it to all three lists – Faustino G. Dy III of the province of Isabela.

Dy's impressive performance comes as no surprise given his solid track record and sterling reputation as an excellent local chief executive. The individual awards bestowed upon the governor match and reinforce Isabela's impressive gallery of over sixty of the most prestigious national and regional awards from the most reputable and discriminating award giving institutions in both the public and private sectors.

#### EXCELLENT EXECUTIVES

The Search for the Ten Most Outstanding Governors in the Philippines was initiated by the Palace and conducted by the DILG. The list includes Governor Marcos of Ilocos Norte, Governor Dy of Isabela, Governor Cua of Quirino, Governor Firmalo of Romblon, Governor Marañon of Negros Occidental, Governor Chatto of Bohol, Governor Davide of Cebu, Governor Fuentes of South Cotabato, Governor Matba of Agusan del Norte and Governor Alvarez of Palawan.

The awardees collectively referred to as the *honor list*, had to undergo a three-stage screening process. They were chosen based on good governance, transparency, business competitiveness and disaster preparedness. Their anti-drug stance also played a key factor in the selection, it being a major policy of the Duterte administration. The list was announced close to the heels of the release of the "*horror list*", which, according to the president, is a list of government officials allegedly involved in the drug trade. "*If there are bad guys in government, there are also good guys,*" he was quoted as saying.

According to a top official of the DILG, "*Containing the illegal drugs problem is only one thing. These governors are also model governors. They are awardees. They are good in disaster preparedness, and they have made their provinces competitive when it comes to business. They are model leaders, model local executives.*"

#### SUPERBRAND'S SUPER GOVS

Meanwhile, the Outstanding Governorship Award is a project of Superbrand Marketing International Inc. (SMI), a private entity based in Makati City. SMI endeavors to honor quality governance throughout the country. Recipients of the award are governors who enable inclusive growth among their constituents and demonstrate stellar public service. The 2017 Outstanding Governorship Awardees include Governor Alvarado of Bulacan, Governor Dy of Isabela, Governor Hataman of ARRM, Governor Marcos of Ilocos Norte, Governor Mendoza of Cotabato, Governor Rodriguez of Sorsogon, Governor Tan of Samar, Governor Umali of Nueva Ecija, Governor Villafuerte of Camarines Sur and Governor Yap of Tarlac.

The award is the fifth Outstanding Governorship Award for Dy.

According to Mr. Henry Tambuatco,

president and chief executive officer of SMI, assessment is done through a thorough research of the candidates' projects and their actual impact on the constituency. "*The Outstanding Governorship Award is given to selected governors who highly deserve it and we have embarked on this endeavor to acknowledge the efforts of our government officials for their extraordinary role in nation building,*" he said.

While the Search for the Ten Most Outstanding Governors was initiated by government institutions, the Outstanding Governorship Award is a purely private initiative. There are only two governors common to both lists – Dy of Isabela and Marcos of Ilocos Norte.

#### SEAL OF APPROVAL

The third test, the most dreaded but most coveted by any local chief executive is the DILG's Seal of Good Local Governance. Only twenty-eight of the country's eighty-one provinces passed the 2017 SGLG.

At a time when the DILG has made it even more difficult to pass the Seal, Isabela obtained a perfect score in all four core areas to include Good Financial Administration, Disaster Preparedness, Social Protection, Peace and Order, and all three essential areas to include Business-Friendliness and Competitiveness, Environmental Protection and Tourism, Culture and the Arts.

SGLG symbolizes integrity and good performance through continuing governance reform and sustained local government. It is a progressive assessment system adopted by the Department to give distinction to remarkable local government performance across several areas.

One of the incentives for SGLG passers is access to the *performance challenge fund*, a facility envisioned to help stimulate local governments to mainstream transparency and accountability and to enable them to finance projects supportive of national government goals and priorities.

Isabela's compelling story behind all the awards and accolades makes us realize that indeed, it pays to champion excellence in local governance. For Dy, however, more than the glory and the incentives, it is the wisdom in instilling excellence that proves most important. "*The true mark of a champion is constantly doing one's best long after the jurors have left. The sacred task of a champion is to assert the culture of excellence in all human endeavors, especially governance. The people of Isabela*

*deserve no less,*" he declared with the firm resolve of a trailblazing, ground breaking, no-nonsense, breakthrough governor imbued with the will of a warrior, the courage of a crusader, and the heart of a champion.

#### THE CHAMP

The word champion partakes of two meanings. A champion, from the Latin *campio*, refers to the victor in any challenge, contest or competition. Champion may also refer to one who fights in behalf of another or one who undertakes to defend a cause. Both definitions are apt to describe Dy as a victor and as an advocate, but he prefers the latter because this is what he does passionately on a day-to-day basis. "*We win awards because of what we espouse on a daily basis. It may be about championing DRRM or child rights, or the right of the youth to free education or the right of the marginalized farmers,*" he stressed. "*This is what keeps us going. We in the local government must not only focus on policy, we must also actively engage in advocacy. The combination of both makes for excellent governance.*"

Dy learned the ropes of governance first as a youth leader and later as a village chief. From the bottom of the political ladder, he rose from the ranks with a very impressive career trajectory spanning over three decades of public service. He is a three-term mayor, three-term congressman, and now on his third term as governor. The *third* in Faustino Dy III must symbolize the three full consecutive terms he completes for every position he sets his eyes on, a rare feat given the dynamics of Isabela's vast political landscape and the unpredictable behavior of its electorate.

So what's next for one of the Philippines' most outstanding governors? His eyes lit up as he explore the trail he so masterfully blazed for others who would wish to thread the narrow path to excellence.

Woe to the competition. This champ is just getting started.

# Door-to-door delivery ng gamit pang-PWD isinasagawa ni Cong. Albano

Ibinaling naman ni Congressman Rodito Albano ang kanyang atensyon sa pagtugon sa pangangailangan ng mga PWD o *persons with dignity* ng lalawigan ng Isabela upang maibsan ang hirap na kanilang dinaranas at unti-unting bumalik sa normal ang kanilang kalagayan.

Nakipagugnayan ang tanggapan ni Albano sa mga alkalde ng iba't-ibang bayan at siyudad upang matunton ang mga PWD kahit sa pinakaliblib na barangay at maideliver sa kanilang mga tahanan ang wheelchair, saklay, walker at iba pang assistive devices, depende sa kanilang medical condition o pangangailangan.

Batay sa mga datos na nakalap ng tanggapan ni Albano, karamihan sa mga nabigyan ng wheelchair ay mga senior citizens na stroke patients at kapos sa pera. Dahil sa kanilang kundisyon, hindi na sila makapunta sa munisipyo o sa Kapitolyo, kung kaya't kinakailangang dalhin sa kani-kanilang mga tahanan ang mga naturang devices na makakatulong sa kanilang mas maayos na pagkilos o paglakad.

Umaabot sa halos isang libong PWD na ang nabigyan ng mga assistive devices sa dalawampung bayan

ng Isabela, 365 sa kanila ang nabigyan ng wheelchair. Ayon sa tala ng Provincial Social Welfare Development Office, humigit-kumulang na 13,122 ang PWD sa lalawigan ng Isabela.

Sa ilalim ng panunungkulan ni Governor Faustino Dy III at Vice Governor Antonio Albano, ay itinayo ang PWD Center sa tabi ng Provincial Social Welfare and Development Office Ito rin ang nagsisilbing tanggapan ng Focal Person on PWD's Concerns at ng Federation of PWD. Ang PSWDO ang nangangasiwa sa Center na ito.

Upang lalo pang mapalakas ang hanay ng mga may kapansanan, ang Federation ay nakatanggap ng pondong isang milyong piso mula sa pamahalaang panlalawigan para sa livelihood assistance at iba pang pangangailangan ng sektor.

Sa pakikipagtulungan ng iba't-ibang lokal na ehekutibo ay mahigpit ding ipinatutupad ni Dy ang mga probisyon ng RA 10754, isang batas na nagpapalawig sa mga kapakinabangan at pribileheyo ng mga PWD, kabilang na ang 20% discount at VAT exemption sa mga nabiling "goods and services".

# 407M PISO INILAN NINA DY, ALBANO PARA SA 1,018 BARANGAY



Muling naglaan ng apat na raan at pitong milyong piso na karagdagang Aid to Barangay ang administrasyong Dy-Albano para sa 1,018 barangay na bumubuo sa lalawigan ng Isabela. Ito ang ipinahayag ni Governor Faustino Dy III sa kanyang mensahe sa mahigit isang libong punong barangay na nagtipon-tipon sa Subic Bay Convention Center noong Marso 11 – 13, 2018 para sa 15th Provincial Congress ng Liga ng mga Barangay ng Isabela. Ang naturang pondo ay maaari nilang gamitin para sa kanilang Priority Development Projects katulad ng multi-purpose pavements at pagsasaayos ng mga lansangan.

Hiniling ni Dy sa mga kinauukulan na magsumite na ng mga dokumento sa Commission on Audit para sa liquidation ng aid to barangay na una na nilang natanggap upang magtuloy-tuloy na ang pamamahagi ng naturang pondo na nakalaan para sa mga tao.

Hiniling din ni Dy kay Vice Governor Antonio Albano at sa Sangguniang Panlalawigan na maglaan ng pondo para sa pagpapagawa ng limang drying facilities. Ayon sa gobernador, malaking tulong ito sa mga magasasaka sapagkat ang bawat drying facility ay kayang magpatuyo ng hanggang 5,000 kaban sa loob lamang ng isang araw.

Ipinahayag din ni Dy ang muling pagarangkada ng Dagdag-kita para sa Magsasaka Caravan katuwang ang National Food Authority. Sa ilalim ng programa ay binibili ng pamahalaang panlalawigan at ng NFA ang mga produktong palay ng mga maliliit na magsasaka sa ilalim ng mas pinalawig na Ayuda sa Presyo at Pantawid Pamasahang Program na nakapaloob sa Bojje-Rodito Opportunities (BRO) for Marginalized Farmers Program.

Napuntahan na ng Caravan ang mga liblib na barangay ng Delfin Albano, San Guillermo, Benito Soliven, San Mariano, at lungsod ng Ilagan na lubos na ikinagalak ng mga maliliit na magsasaka sa mga naturang pook dahil ramdam nila ang patuloy na malasakit ng pangasiwaang Dy-Albano. Ayon kay Dy, “Ang mga ganitong programa ang siyang daan upang maipaabot sa mga malalayong lugar ang mga magagandang hakbang ng pamahalaan na siyang magpapaangat sa antas ng pamumuhay upang unti-unti, kundi man tuluyang mawala ang kahirapan sa kanayunan.”

Naglaan din ang pamahalaang panlalawigan ng paunang isang milyong piso bilang loan assistance sa mga maliliit na negosyante at mga dating Overseas Filipino Workers (OFWs). Target ng programa na makapagpahiram ng tig-sampung libong piso na dagdag kapital sa sampung libong tagapangasiwa ng micro small enterprises o maliliit na negosyo kasama na ang mga OFWs na nagsibalik na sa bansa.

Ayon sa datos ng Philippine Statistics Authority, nakapagtala ng 26% poverty incidence ang lalawigan ng Isabela noong taong 2009. Noong 2012, bumaba ito sa 21%. Nagkaroon ng panibagong census noong 2015, at ito’y tuluyang bumaba sa 5%, kung kaya’t 16% na lamang ang poverty incidence sa lalawigan ng Isabela. Inaasahang magtutuloy-tuloy pa ang pagbaba ng mga pigura dahil sa mga programa ng pamahalaang panlalawigan na naglalayong maitaas ang antas ng pamumuhay ng mga mamamayan.

“Sama-sama nating talunin ang kahirapan!”, pagwawakas ni Dy.

# Another first in Philippine DRRM history!



## DIGGING INTO THE COMPLEXITIES OF DRRM

Garbed in his signature Isabela working shirt, jeans and sneakers, Governor Faustino Dy III buckled down to work, picked up the shovel and started digging to mark the ground breaking of the IDRRM Complex. The visionary in him believes that it takes a Complex to address the complexities of DRRM, and that in order to change the world, we must work from the ground up.

### **Governor Faustino G. Dy III is bringing DRRM to the next level!**

Breaking new ground in disaster risk reduction and management, the young governor led in the ground breaking ceremony for his most ambitious project to date – the Isabela DRRM Complex, another first in Philippine DRRM history.

As envisioned, the Complex will initially consist of the PDRRMC-BFP Headquarters, which has been completed and is already operational, the Provincial Social Welfare Development Office, the Public Safety Office, the PDRRMC Command Center, the PDRRMC – PAGASA Weather Bureau, the Climate Change Center, plus sports facilities for Council members, first responders and rescuers.

The ceremony was made part of the evaluation for the 19th Gawad Kalasag National Finals, witnessed by Council members and national evaluators led by its Chair Joselito Magumun of DILG Manila.

During the blessing of the PDRRMC-BFP Headquarters, Dy realized that the HQ was erected right smack in the middle of a sprawling piece of land

owned by the provincial government and strategically located along the Maharlika Highway, just a stone's throw away from the Capitol. *“There is adequate space for more buildings that will comprise the Complex,”* he said. *“Complex problems entail building an entire Complex to hasten inter-agency cooperation and coordination in addressing disasters,”* he added.

*“Only a brain that works non-stop, that never ceases to think about the welfare of Isabeleños could have thought of a DRRM Complex,”* exclaimed Provincial Administrator Noel Manuel Lopez. *“For visionaries like the governor, the only limitation is the imagination,”* he added.

Dy's well earned reputation as a DRRM champion precedes him. He sought the institutionalization of policies and measures aimed at strengthening the PDRRMC, intensified the training of personnel and invested in top-of-the-line facilities, vehicles and equipment essential to disaster preparedness. He established the PDRRMO, organized the Disaster Action and Response Team (DART 831) which operates 24/7 and enhanced inter-agency cooperation among the Armed Forces of

the Philippines, the Philippine National Police and the Bureau of Fire Protection.

One year and six months into his third term as governor, PDRRMC Isabela was finally elevated to the Gawad Kalasag Hall of Fame. Despite the honors, Dy always reminds everybody never to lull into complacency. *“Given the complexities of the challenges we have to face on a regular basis, it is important that we constantly raise the bar in DRRM,”* he stressed.

Not only is he going to raise the bar in DRRM, he is building the first-ever DRRM Complex in the world.

# Dy, Singson DRRM of Solid North



## FORMIDABLE

Isabela Governor Faustino Dy III, Chair of PDRRMC Isabela and Ilocos Sur Governor Ryan Singson, National President of the League of Provinces of the Philippines, make a formidable team in championing DRRM in the country.

**Top officials of Isabela and Ilocos Sur are dreaming of a solid north in the realm of Disaster Risk and Reduction Management, as a prelude to strengthening inter-LGU cooperation among the country's eighty one provinces toward a more disaster resilient Philippines. The tandem behind this idea is formidable – Isabela Governor Faustino Dy III, Chair of the Gawad Kalasag Best PDRRMC in the Philippines, and Ilocos Sur Governor Ryan Singson, National President of the League of Provinces of the Philippines.**

Dy discussed the urgent need to forge partnership among provinces as a means to strengthen DRRM in the country during the welcome and fellowship dinner in honor of guests from the PDRRM Response Team of Ilocos Sur sent by Singson to learn from Isabela's DRRM experience. The team was led by PDRRMO Michael Chan.

In a letter to Dy, Singson congratulated PDRRMC Isabela for its triumph in the Gawad Kalasag. *"The award given truly marks your success in maintaining proactive and efficient delivery of risk prevention methods and processes. I am confident that we can draw inspiration from your PDRRM team for the development plans pertaining disaster preparedness for our province as well,"* he wrote. Ilocos Sur bested all provinces in Region I in the 2017 Gawad Kalasag Regional Finals.

Dy thanked Singson for the honor of the visit. *"Sana sa maikling panahon na nandito kayo ay inyong makita hindi lamang ang aming kahandaan, kung hind maging ang kagandahan ng aming lalawigan sa larangan ng agrikultura at turismo."* Dy also stressed that the people of Isabela and Ilocos Sur share the same culture. *"Marami kaming ka-probinsya na galing sa Ilocos, kaya halos pareho ang ating kultura at paniniwala."*

During the second day of the visit, Provincial Administrator Noel Manuel Lopez briefed the guests on the policies, programs and best practices of PDRRMC Isabela as

requested. *"The true essence of being a Gawad Kalasag champion is to use the award as a platform to convey the importance of DRRM to anyone who cares to listen. We thank Ilocos Sur for the opportunity to share the Isabela experience,"* he said. The guests were also given a guided tour of the Provincial Evacuation and Multi-Purpose Center and the PDRRMC – BFP Headquarters.

In 2012, Dy established *Project: Rescuers Without Borders* because he believes that public service knows no boundaries. The project has brought PDRRMC Isabela members and rescuers to as far as Albay, Davao del Sur, Bulacan and Leyte, among other provinces, to conduct rescue and relief operations.

Recently, the Sangguniang Panlalawigan of Albay filed a Resolution to enter into a sisterhood agreement with the province of Isabela to explore avenues of cooperation in the field of disaster preparedness. In a related development, the province of Oriental Mindoro signified its intention to conduct a Sisterhood-Case Replication Tour in the province of Isabela to *"further gain knowledge in DRRM practices of other LGUs particularly their local DRRM councils and offices."* The request was contained in a letter of Governor Alfonso Umali Jr. to Governor Dy.

Inter-LGU cooperation is enshrined in the Local Government Code and is strongly encouraged by Republic Act 10121 or the DRRM Act.

# Child rights protection tops Dy-Albano Agenda for 2018



**O**n January 8, 2018, the first working Monday of the year, Governor Faustino Dy III launched his most important initiative to date – Project: Ugnayan ng Batang Isabeleño at Nagbabantay na Gobyerno, the official child protection hotline of the province of Isabela. The project is an inter-LGU, inter-agency and multi-sectoral child protection initiative aimed at providing access, immediate response and a more holistic government intervention to children in crisis.

Front and center in this very crucial project is the Provincial Council for the Protection of Children (PCPC), working very closely with the Provincial Inter-Agency Council Against Trafficking

(PIACAT). The PCPC is the institutional mechanism that advocates child rights, plans and initiates, recommends interventions and monitors children's programs and projects. PIACAT ensures multi-agency and multi-sectoral participation and cooperation in policy-making and planning programs, projects and activities to reduce human trafficking, child abuse and other related concerns. Both Councils are chaired by the governor and co-chaired by the vice governor.

In his message, Dy stressed the urgent need to institutionalize a child protection hotline mechanism to address the alarming increase in child abuse cases in the country. *“Our success in other spheres of governance is an exercise in futility if we fail to protect the rights of society's most vulnerable sector – our children. Huwag po sana nating iasa na lamang sa pribadong sektor ang isang responsibilidad na dapat*

*nakaatang sa ating mga balikat,”* he said in obvious reference to Bantay Bata 163, a pioneering effort of ABS-CBN.

The launch was witnessed by top officials of government, plus a mix of education officials led by ISU President Ricmar Aquino, PDRRC members and employees of the provincial government. What made the ceremony more touching though, was the presence of children from the Early Learning Center operated by the Provincial Government of Isabela through the Provincial Social Welfare and Development Office. The ELC was elevated to the Hall of Fame during the 18th Gawad Kalasag after having been adjudged Best Early Learning Center in the Philippines for three consecutive years. Assistant PSWDO and newly designated Focal Person for Children's Concerns Gina Rivero answered the inaugural call.

According to PSWDO Lucila Ambatali, *“The launch of Project: UBING on the very first Monday of the new year is a clear and unequivocal statement that the protection of the rights of children remains to be the top priority in the Agenda of the Provincial Government of Isabela under the watch of Governor Dy and Vice Governor Antonio Albano.”*

# FGD III: Support to 16,000 BRO scholars continues



**G**overnor Faustino Dy III vowed full and unceasing support to some sixteen thousand BRO-Ed scholars in light of the enactment and impending implementation of RA 10931 or the *Universal Access to Quality Tertiary Education Act*. Dy gave the assurance before some three hundred fifty youth leaders who gathered recently at Japi Hotel in Cauayan City for the **SECOND PROVINCIAL YOUTH SUMMIT**.

RA 10931 was signed into law by President Rodrigo Duterte on August 3, 2016 with an allocation of forty billion pesos to cover cost of tertiary education for all Filipino students enrolled in government schools.

Dy declared that the thirty million pesos allocated for the 16,000 scholars shall instead be used to cover other education-related expenses. *“Ang pondong nakalaan para sa mga kabataan ay mananatiling para sa kabataan. Ito po ay maaari ninyong gamitin sa iba pang gastusin para lalo pang mabawasan ang alalahanin ng inyong mga magulang at maging mas maayos ang inyong pag-aaral,”* he said, eliciting a rapturous applause

from the audience. *“Ang edukasyon ay hindi pribilehiyo, kundi karapatan ng bawat kabataang Filipino. We should thank the president and Congress for this revolutionary legislative measure.”*

He also thanked First District Congressman Rodito Albano for constantly infusing funds to cover part of the cost of the BRO-Ed program. *“Nasa Congress pa lang kami, marami na kaming scholars ni Rod. Dito nag-umpisa ang BRO-Ed.”* He reminisced.

Reymel Resposo, a former student leader and BRO scholar, now works for the provincial government as Focal Person of the scholarship program. According to Resposo, the provincial government provides college scholarship to sons and daughters of small farmers through BRO-Ed, one of the thirteen components of the Bojie Rodito Opportunities for Small Farmers Program. It is designed to provide educational assistance to marginalized farmers who dream of having at least one college graduate in the family, as a means to empower the ranks of farmer-beneficiaries and break the vicious cycle

of poverty in the countryside.

Resposo speaks from experience. He is a living proof of BRO-Ed’s ability to change lives. His story is one of many compelling success stories that convey the Isabelleño’s ability to rise above adversity by dint of diligence and hardwork. *“Malayo na po ang narating ng BRO-Ed at marami nang buhay ang tuluyang nabago dahil dito. Maraming salamat po sa mga nagtaguyod at patuloy na nagtataguyod sa programang ito,”* he said.

# Three-peat Bambanti is Aliw Awards' Best Festival anew

**I**sabela's Bambanti Festival received its third statuette for Best Festival Practices and Performances at the Aliw Awards held recently at the historic Manila Hotel Fiesta Pavillion.

The Bambanti shared the Aliw Awards stage with the brightest stars and performers of the local entertainment industry led by the iconic Ms. Celeste Legazpi who was named "Entertainer of the Year". Provincial Tourism Officer Troy Alexander Miano received the award and delivered the acceptance speech on behalf of Governor Faustino Dy III who was on official travel.

Dy refers to the Bambanti or scarecrow as the ultimate symbol of the diligence, vigilance and resilience of the people of Isabela. Assistant Parish Priest of the Saint Ferdinand Parish Fr. Cannes best director laureate Brillante Mendoza also served as juror in previous Bambanti festivals. He was so inspired by what he saw, that he produced a film entitled Bambanti topbilled by Allisandra de Rossi and directed by Zig Dulay. It was hailed Best Film in last year's Brusells Film Festival in Belgium.

*“I’ve been in theater for a long time and that is one tough act to follow. Ang galing nila,”* exclaimed National Artist for Dance and Aliw Awards founder Ms. Alice Reyes in reference to Governor Faustino Dy III and Vice Governor Antonio Albano, prime movers of the Bambanti Festival. Reyes was guest of honor during the Opening Ceremonies of the biggest cultural event in the province of Isabela.

The doyenne of Philippine culture was very profuse in her appreciation of *“the booths, the products, the food, the incredible hospitality, people we have met...the costumes, the dances, the music and everything that unfolds in front of our own eyes today.”*

*“It is so wonderful that your leaders have continued the Bambanti tradition through all these years because it shows the best that Isabela has to boast and to offer. What I love is that it involves the entire population...everybody participates and that’s wonderful community which speaks of bayanihan spirit,”* she gushed.

Reyes lauded the focus and passion of the officials of the province led by Dy and Albano. *“We need more politicians and public servants like them,”* she declared. *“I love what they’ve done for the farmers, for the mom and pop businesses and now the focus on developing eco-tourism with the building of the roads to the beaches,”* she added.

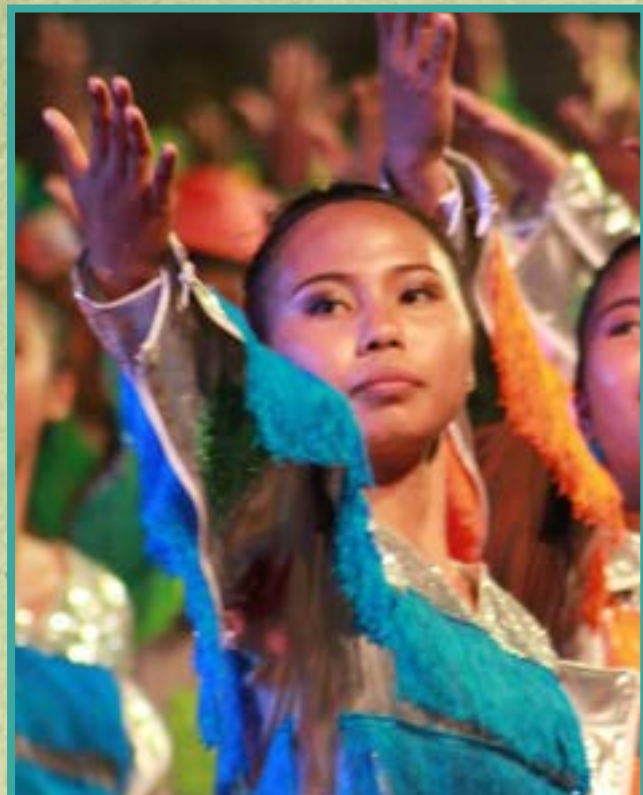

The order is jointly administered by the National Commission for Culture and the Arts (NCCA) and the Cultural Center of the Philippines (CCP) and conferred by the President of the Philippines upon recommendation by both institutions.

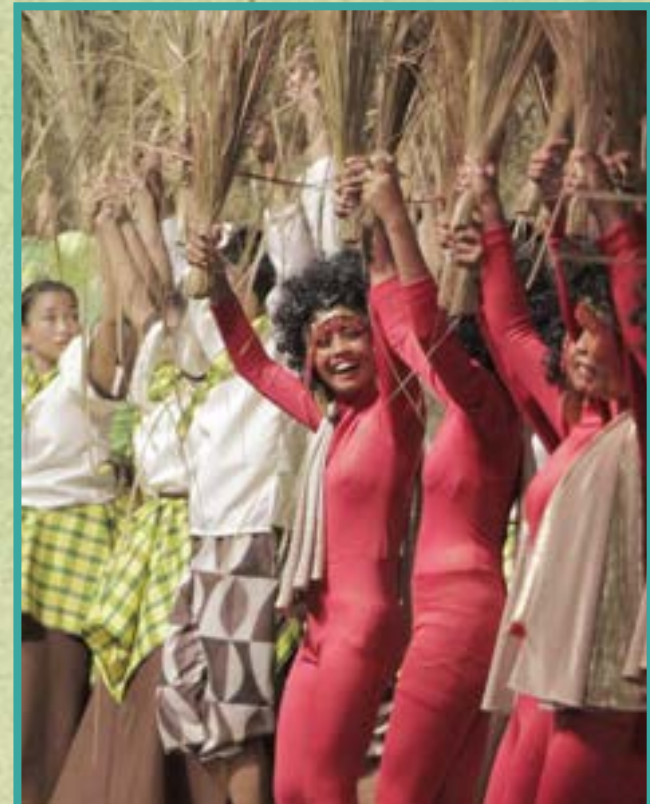
